Rules

1. The Society's District shall consist of the parishes of Slaley, Healey, Hexhamshire and Minsteracres including a radius of three miles from Slaley Show field.
2. The pavilions will open for the setting up of exhibits for competition at 8.00am. We would appreciate early benching, but **all entries must be completed by no later than 10.00am**. Only the Committee and stewards, exhibitors and their assistants will be allowed to enter the pavilions during this time.
3. **No exhibits shall be removed before 5pm**. During the clearance of the pavilions no person shall be allowed to enter except exhibitors and their assistants. Livestock may be removed at the discretion of the Section Secretary concerned.
4. **NO VEHICLE MOVEMENT ON THE FIELD BETWEEN 10-5PM**
5. In the Horticultural Section, exhibitors must declare that the produce has been grown by them and has been in their possession for at least two months except in classes for Floral Art, unless specifically stated otherwise. In the Industrial Section all articles must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
6. Any person charging an exhibitor with violating Rule 5 must do so in writing on the day of the show, depositing £5 with the Secretary, which sum will be forfeited to the Society if the Committee considers the charge to be frivolous.
7. Competent judges shall be appointed by the Committee prior to the day of the show.
8. In each class the judge shall award the first prize to the exhibit adjudged best, irrespective of the number of entries. The decision of the judge shall be final.
9. Prize money will be available from 4.00pm or such other time as may be announced on Show Day. Claims must be made to the Treasurer on the forms provided within seven days of the date of the Show. Prize money unclaimed by that date will be retained by the Society.
10. Any exhibitor proved to have contravened any of the Show Rules will forfeit the whole of any prize money won.
11. In any dispute regarding the Rules of the Show or the Definitions, the decision of the Chairman of the Show shall be final.
12. All trophies shall be held for one year and must be returned no later than one week before the Show.
13. Any amendments, additions or deletions to the foregoing rules shall be made by members at the Annual General Meeting, provided that they do not cause the Society to cease to be a charity by law.
14. Failure to produce an entry ticket may result in having to purchase another entry ticket on the day

TERM A - GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION (GDPR)

By completing the entry form, exhibitors accept that we will retain and share their data, if necessary, with sporting associations and breed societies where relevant.

Competitors' names and addresses will be retained so that some section secretaries can send out next year's schedule to them. Names, and a general place name only, may be given to the local press who publish some of the Show's competition results.





The voice of Slaley Show ...

Hexhamshire based Lewis Short is, for the third year running the 'voice' of Slaley Show who promises to alert the crowd at this year's event to what is happening when and where; he will be something of a dee jay for the whole day of show field of activities.

Lewis is a natural showman and performer. This is his third show having taken over in 2023 from the shows president Robert Forster, the revered veteran voice of many years with an easy line of journalistic questioning as he traversed the field looking for soundbites of anything and anyone of special interest.

As the show has developed over the years the task has expanded to mirror the show field and the timetable, so Lewis not only commands the microphone on the day but co-ordinates input from Dennis Lumley either in the Sheep and Horse section who guides visitors through the judging procedure; the attractions who provide their own spokespeople and a bit of roving reporting as he weaves his way through the crowds vox-popping with the exhibitors, the competitors, section secretaries and of course the visitors!

To put it mildly, he multitasks on Slaley Show Day. Multitasking is something he is used to. He is a farmer, a soon to be forest schoolteacher, a theatrical writer, performer and current producer of Whitley Chapel's Young Farmers Club entries into the National Federation of YFC's annual competitions. Under his direction they won this years and last year's first prize award in the YFC National Finals.





1. Hats

All riders must be wearing a protective helmet when mounted with a chinstrap fastened and adjusted so as to prevent movement of the hat in the event of a fall at any time when on site. To comply with standards listed below:

Skull caps must be of, or worn with a dark coloured plain peaked cover (a coloured peak cover may be worn in the Mounted Fancy Dress).

No recording device to be worn at any time when mounted as it may have a negative effect on the performance of the hat. The Organiser/Official Steward may eliminate any rider on show day who is wearing a hat that doesn't fit correctly, that doesn't comply with standards, or with a chinstrap undone.

2. Equine Flu

Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21-92 days later), followed by the first booster (150-215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose.

Horses must have been vaccinated within 1 year before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show.

We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times.

Vaccinations are subject to local risk assessment by the attending veterinarians.

PLEASE NOTE THAT NEITHER VACCINATION CERTIFICATES NOR PASSPORTS SHOULD BE SENT TO THE SECTION SECRETARY PRIOR TO THE EVENT. HOWEVER, RANDOM CHECKS WILL BE CARRIED OUT ON THE SHOW GROUND DURING THE SHOW.
